New cast-iron pavers as accent pieces echo old iron sewer lids."


PICKS OF THE SEASON IVE HAUGELAND BY SUSAN HEEGER



A native of Norway, landscape architect Ive Haugeland grew up on a farm picking wild achillea from fields around her house. "I've always loved animals and plants," she says, remembering how, while her friends played with dolls, she made gardens for hers, complete with walks, furniture, and flowers. "Now," she jokes, "people pay me to do this!" Shades of Green Landscape Architecture (shadesofgreenla.com), her Sausalito, California, firm, is known for a Scandinavian simplicity of line and an exuberant profusion of plants. She has lately designed a line of garden furniture and accessories named, of course, after her horse: Rhapsody.

WHAT TO READ

"For me, it's *Garrett Eckbo: Modern Landscapes for Living* (University of California Press, 2005) by Marc Treib and Dorothée Imbert. Eckbo did a lot to revolutionize garden design in California, to make it more democratic and available to ordinary people, and to encourage indoor and outdoor living. And he had Norwegian family!"

FURNITURE DESIGN

"The inspiration for our custom line, Rhapsody, was the desire to make something different from what's already out there and to use recycled materials, which usually look so rustic, in more refined ways. Our aluminum stools (pictured here) have seats made from recycled wine barrels—a very local material in the Bay Area. The Barnacle wall planter, also aluminum, can be used alone or in multiple modules to create a simpler, less expensive green wall."



BUILDING BLOCKS

"I like concrete pavers because they are clean and precise. The ones that are from Concrete Collaborative (concrete-collaborative.com) are more exciting than the usual, with more textures, sizes, shapes, and colors to choose from. Some have different aggregates in them for a shell-like texture, others have a wood-like finish."



NURSERY PICK

"Flora Grubb Gardens (floragrubb.com) in San Francisco is the ultimate 'candy store' for any gardener! It's so nicely put together, the spaces are beautiful, and they always have new, interesting plants you can't find elsewhere."

LIGHT IT UP

"I'm having fun with Wallflowers from Flos (usa.flos.com) we've used these glass light fixtures on a wall beside a fountain and on a trellis covered with evergreen clematis. It's a great garden effect, these lit-up, stylized blooms."
